DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

How deep do you want to take your Group? Choose from these questions to lead your discussion.

- 1. Take turns reading LUKE 22:54–62. For what reason did Peter follow Jesus "at a distance"? What do the actions of Peter in this story reveal about his personal character?
- 2. What would make Peter deny that he knew Jesus, when earlier he said he was willing to die for Him?
- 3. In what circumstances are other people able to influence us to act in ways we know are different than God wants for us? Share an example
- 4. Leaders read Luke 22:47-53- How was Peter's denial of Christ different from Judas's betraval of Jesus?
- 5. How should we respond when we fail to obey Christ? How would you define true repentance?
- 6. What did Jesus do the third time Peter denied knowing Him? (22:61)
- 7. In what ways has the Lord made you aware of a sin in your life in the past? How did you respond? How SHOULD we respond to the convicting voice of God?
- 8. Why was Peter so upset and bitter about his actions?
- 9. What could you do this week to strengthen your stand for Christ in the face of pressure from others? How does Easter relate to this?
- 10. In the future, how could you encourage another believer who has done something wrong but shows a willingness to repent?
- 11. This is the LAST week of questions- talk about the details of your group party and outreach schedule.
